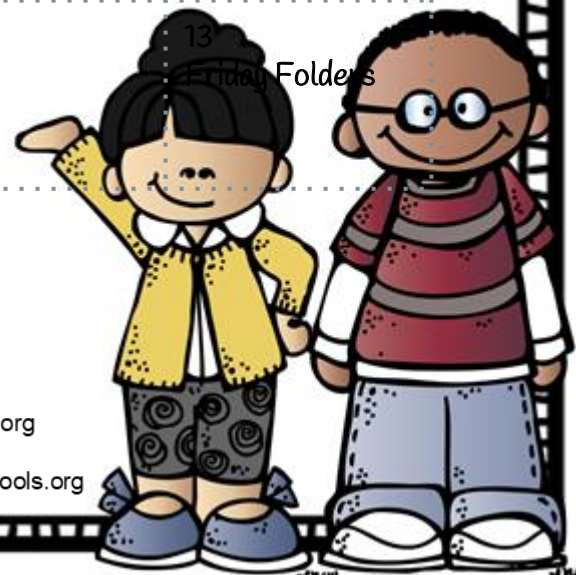

ON LEVEL: Next week, students will be reviewing and assessing bar graphs, pictographs, and line plots. In addition we will be reviewing and taking our Unit Assessment at the end of the week. Your teacher will be in contact with dates. Review the study guide to keep up at home!

Math

ADVANCED MATH with MS. LESCHER: I am sending home a study guide tomorrow.....you don't need to complete it. We will work on it in class next week. I just want you to know what will be on the test. The test date is Thursday FEB 27. Please let me know if you have any questions. Our next Math Unit will be comparing fractions and fraction equivalents.

ACCELERATED MATH with MS. BLOUNT: Students will learn how to use decimal notation for fractions with denominators of 10 and 100. This is the first time they will use decimals to communicate a fraction.

Students will do this by making connections between fractions with denominators of 10 and 100 and the place value chart. By reading fraction names, students say thirty-two hundredths and rewrite this as 0.32 or represent it with a place value chart.

Reading

In reading, we will be beginning our test prep unit as Milestones are just around the corner. This unit is meant to review all of this year's skills and fire kids up to their peak performance for test day.

*Keep up at home with iReady Reading and keeping up with both fiction and nonfiction

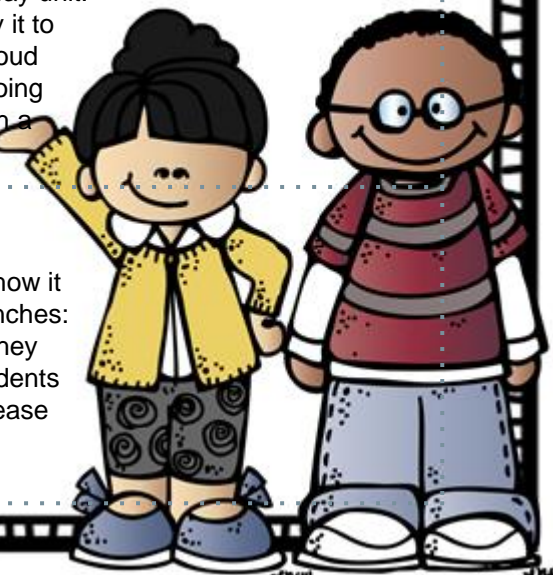
Writing

In writing next week, we will continue our Baby Literature Essay unit.

In this unit, students will take their persuasive skills and apply it to book characters. The students will write claims about read aloud texts and learn how to justify a character trait or change by going back to the mentor text for evidence. This unit intertwines with a lot of our reading skills so keeping up at home will be similar!

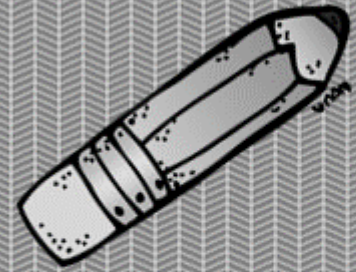
Social Studies

Next week we will finish covering how our government operates. Students will understand the term democracy and how it translates to the United States. 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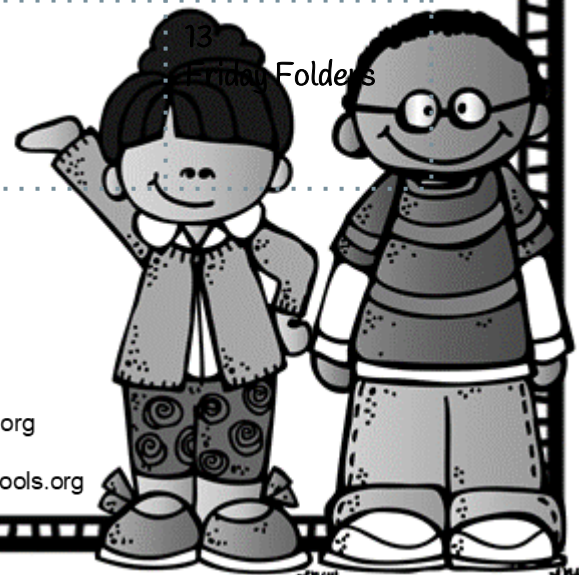

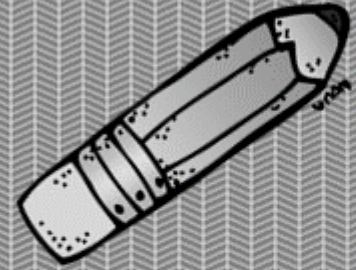
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
