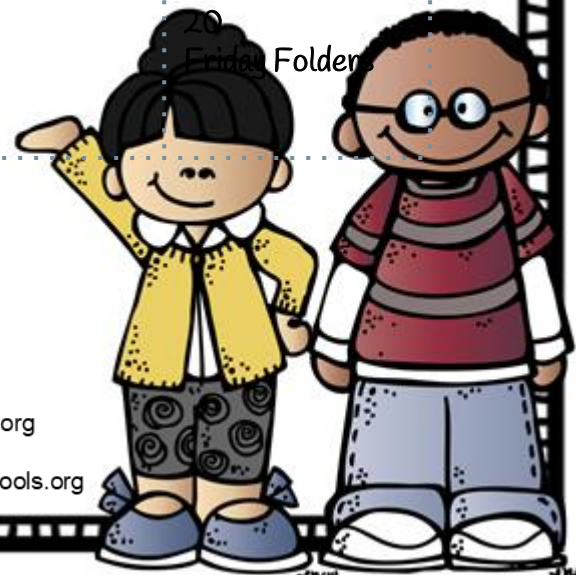

Math

ON LEVEL: Next week in math, we will begin our elapsed time unit. This includes reading an analog clock to the minute and being able to add and subtract to find the time passed. To keep up at home, have your child practice reading an analog clock or telling how much time a specific activity lasted.

ADVANCED MATH with MS. LESCHER: We will begin our unit about fraction equivalence and ordering, comparing fractions, and developing understanding of fractions as numbers. We are also working on spiral review concepts for 3rd grade math as independent work, to prepare for the Grade 3 Math in Milestones. Prodigy has a Milestones Prep feature that your child can work on at home.

ACCELERATED MATH with MS. BLOUNT: This week the students will be reviewing and taking their test on Thursday. The study guide was sent home. Please reach out if you would like additional practice for your child.

Reading

In reading, we will continue our test prep unit as Milestones are just around the corner. Writing

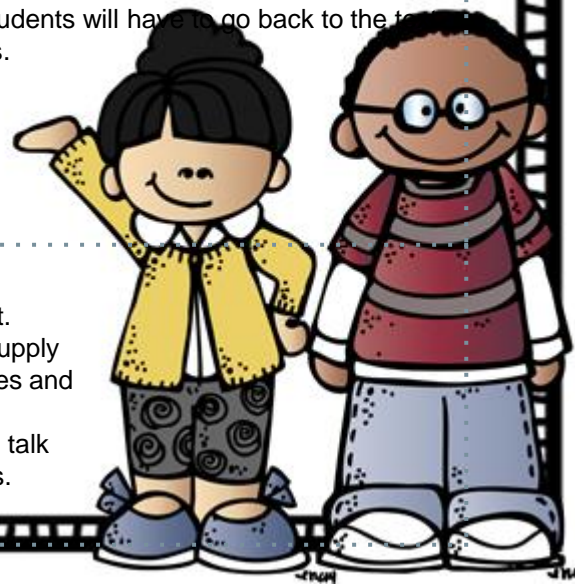

Social Studies

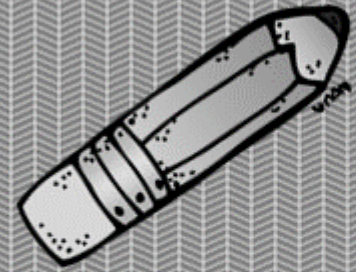

To keep up at home, take your child shopping with you and talk about the difference between wants and needs as it applies.



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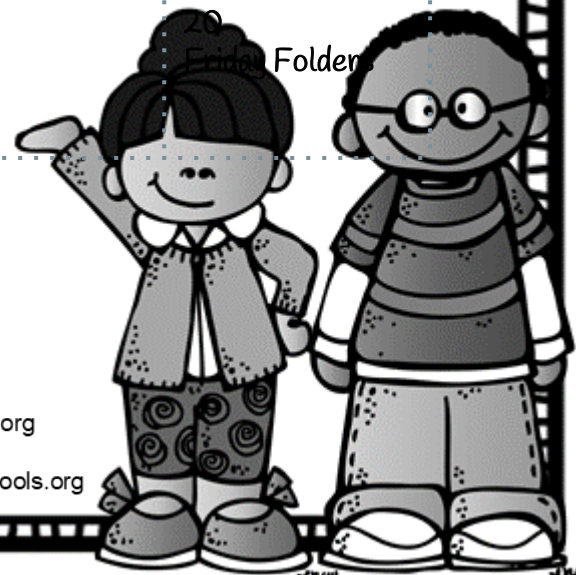
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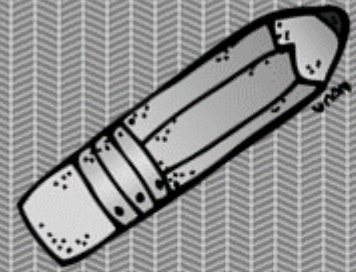
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
