

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

Next Week: How You Can Help at Home

ON LEVEL: Next week, we will explore the relationship of equivalent fractions through both a visual and number line models. To keep up at home, you can have your child share a treat where they need to partition it into equal size pieces. They can explain another way they could cut up the piece where you would each receive the same amount! Example, you could cut a cake into halves or fourths. If you ate one half it would be the same as eating two fourths. You can also always practice with iReady math.

Math

ADVANCED MATH with MS. LESCHER: We will continue to work on partial product, partial quotient, and begin to generate and analyze patterns. Please be sure to practice multiplication facts when possible.

ACCELERATED MATH with MS. BLOUNT: We will be taking our test next week on Wednesday the 12th. Study guides were sent home Wednesday of this week. Please let me know if you have any questions.

Reading

In reading, we will be continuing to identify strong character traits and using text evidence to support our conclusions. We will also continue our work on finding the main idea of a passage and touch the surface of themes present in literature. We will explore these ides in our two read alouds, *Because of Winn Dixie* and *Dyamonde Daniel*. If you are looking to help at home, ask your child about the themes present in their literature and how that lesson learned from through their character can apply to themselves.

Writing

In writing next week, we will continue our Baby Literature Essay unit. In this unit, students will take their persuasive skills and apply it to book characters. The students will write claims about read aloud texts and learn how to justify a character trait by going back to the mentor text for evidence. This unit intertwines with a lot of our reading skills so keeping up at home will be similar!

Social Studies Next week we will dive into a new social studies unit covering hour government operates. Students will understand the term democracy and how it translates to the United States. We will explore the three branches: their duties, important job titles within each branch and how they work together through a system of checks and balances. To keep up at home, you can ask your student what the role of the judicial, executive, and legislative branch. You could even relate this to current events that are going on in our political sector currently.
