

Next Week: How You Can Help at Home

For math next week, students will continue working on our concept of area. We will be transitioning from counting square tiles into understanding area as multiplying length times width and applying it to word problems. You can help at home by continuing with multiplication fact fluency as it will be extremely beneficial for this topic. Check out our unit letter for more examples on this topic! Do not forget you can always add in practice with iReady as well.

Math

ADVANCED MATH with MS. LESCHER: We will be working with whole numbers to a million; writing them, comparing them, and rounding them. Students will also fluently add and subtract multi digit whole numbers using the standard algorithm. This means they will be adding and subtracting large numbers with regrouping. (Examples: 4000-2456= 4999+3678=) Many of the students are quite rusty with these regrouping skills. Parents please check your child's take home folder for examples of problems we are working on in class.

ACCELERATED MATH with MS. BLOUNT: Next week we will continue our study on fractions! Students will compare two fractions with different numerators and different denominators, by creating common denominators or numerators, or by comparing to a benchmark fraction such as 1/2. We will be testing before break, so students will receive their study guide on Wednesday.

Reading

In reading this week, we will continue reading to learn in our nonfiction unit. Students will dive deep into finding the main idea using text evidence to support their answers. You can help at home by choosing to read nonfiction books with your child and find the main idea of chapters and supporting details. Your child can recall these using their hand as a guide or a boxes and bullet format. Make sure your child is differentiating their opinion from that of the author's. If you are looking for more reinforcement do not forget about logging into MyOn.com to log hours that could win tickets to the March Madness Final Four game being hosted in Atlanta in 2020. You can also logon to iReady reading for more explicit reading instruction practice.


Writing
