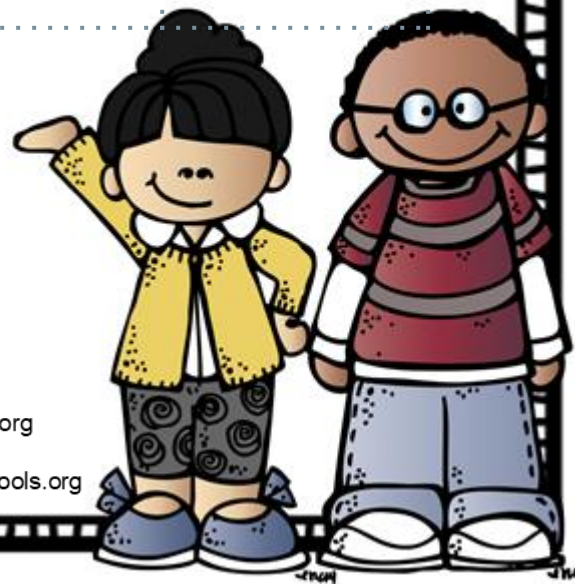

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Our Upcoming Week: How You Can Help at Home

For math this week, students will begin continue working in Unit 3, focusing this week on recognizing multiplication patterns through multiplication tables and in and out boxes. They will be asked to identify rules and fill in missing numbers to these sequences. You can help at home by helping your child differentiate between multiples and factors of a number. Your child can also practice skip counting with more difficult numbers like 3, 4, 6, 7, 8, and 9. Check out our unit letter for more examples on this topic! Do not forget you can always add in practice with iReady at home.

Math

ADVANCED MATH with MS. LESCHER: We will be reviewing elapsed time, measurement (grams/mg, liters/ml), to the nearest $\frac{1}{4}$ inch on a ruler, creating and reading graphs (including line plots), and telling time to the nearest minute. Right now I plan on our Unit Assessment to be WED November 20. That way the kids have 2 days to take the assessment and won't forget anything over the break. The students brought home a study guide last night to review Practicing multiplication and division facts to the 12s is always something that can be worked on at home. We will begin the 4th grade Math curriculum in December. I will send information to you before we begin.

ACCELERATED MATH with MS. BLOUNT:As you know, we postponed the test. 😊 Students needed more practice with multiplying with the area model and dividing with partial quotients. We will continue to review this week and we will test on Wednesday, November 11th. The study guide was sent home on Wednesday, November 13th. Please reach out if you have any questions.

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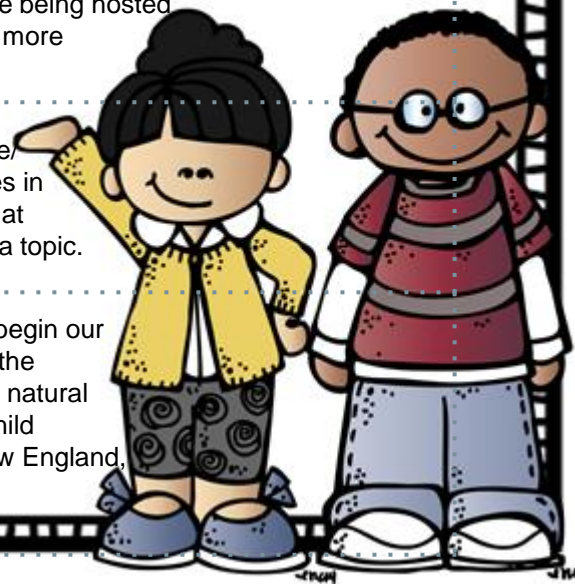

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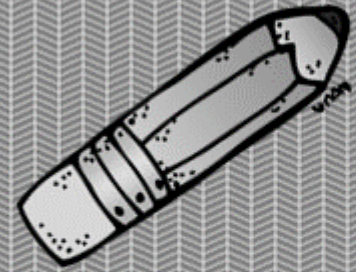
Social Studies

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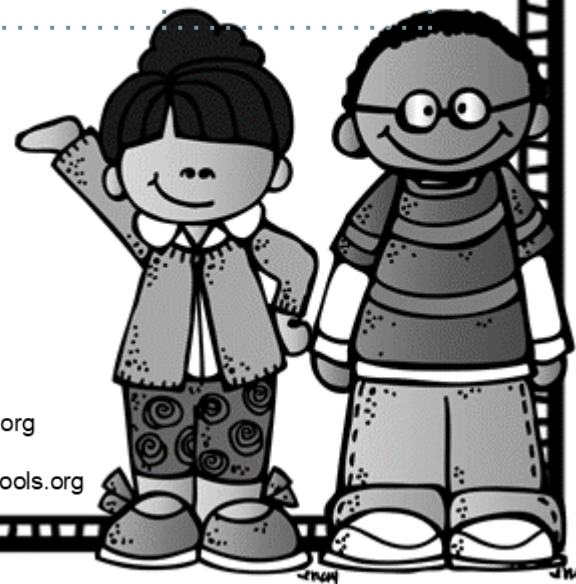
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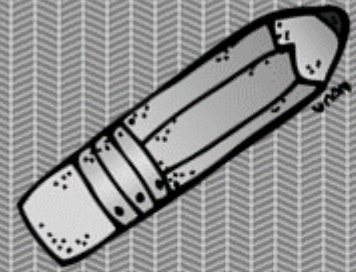
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
