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WHAT'S HAPPENING IN...

Math

Students will take their math unit test this week that will cover everything we have learned so far including: rounding to the nearest ten and hundred, addition and subtraction up to a thousand, and interpreting the data from bar and picture graphs. For the earlier half of the week, students will be reviewing the strategies we learned within these topics.

Advanced Math with Ms. Lescher: We will be taking our Unit 4 Math test on Mon 9-16 and Tues 9-17. TAG students actually have 30 minutes of Math on Mondays so they can begin their test. Our next unit will be comparing fractions.

Accelerated Math with Ms. Blount: Students will use the four operations to solve word problems involving distances, intervals of time, liquid volumes, masses of objects, and money, including problems involving simple fractions or decimals, and problems that require expressing measurements given in a larger unit in terms of a smaller unit. They will represent measurement quantities using diagrams such as number line diagrams that feature a measurement scale.

Reading

In reading this week, students will learn to decode and make sense of figurative language. Students will work on stopping and jotting while reading to talk back to the text and differentiate themselves from their characters. As students talk back to the text, we will also work to raise the level of our questions to unearth deeper meanings and unveil the author's purpose.

Writing

In writing this week, students be entering the revision stage for their small moment narratives. Students will work to find meaning in their stories and revise in big ways all the while still adding proper capitalization and punctuation especially targeting quotations and commas in dialogue. While revising, we will look at our mentor text for this unit, *Come on Rain* to guide us specifically in strengthening endings for our pieces.

Science

Third graders will be studying Habitats, Adaptations, and the Environment for the next 4 weeks. We have many engaging activities planned for the lab with Mrs. Rains.

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
